Where We're Going

We've complete out math unit on Addition and Subtraction. We learned many new strategies to help us do mental math. We will now exploring Data Management until the holidays. Students are learning how to interpret data in various graphs, as well as represent data.

We'll continue to learn about the Writing Process while writing Persuasive Paragraphs. Students have been given personal feedback to bump up their writing. Ask your child what feedback they received.

We're currently reading The Invention of Hugo Cabret in class and using it to practice the reading comprehension strategy Asking Questions. Students are learning the difference between thin and thick questions using a question chart. We will celebrate by watching the movie before the holiday.

In Social Studies, students have been learning about Living and Working in Ontario. They've researched a specific community and are now in the process of creating a Slide Show to present their information to the class. This unit will continue after the holiday.

We'll be wrapping up our Forces unit in Science very soon. We've conducted lots of investigations exploring different forces. It's been very hands-on and a lot of fun!


