Looking Ahead: May

Students are starting to work on a Non-Fiction Book Talk in class. After reading a non-fiction book at their level, they will conduct a short presentation explaining the purpose of various text features and how they help readers to understand and explore information.

We're continuing to explore life in 1780-1850 by looking at different settler groups, exploring our own pasts, and making connections between life then and now.

We've started to explore Soil in Science with the visit of a Scientist in our school last week. This unit will quickly transition into Plants. We've started to grow some different flowers and vegetables in our classroom, courtesy of the Acton Community Garden.

We'll be exploring Length, Perimeter, and Area as well as Number and Geometric Patterns this month. To extend learning at home, students could practice using a ruler, estimating and then checking various distances, and find patterns around their homes.


